



One trailhead entry point, Dockside Park, is planned for Cold Spring Village. The other five main entry points are all north of the Village. Hikers who arrive by train at Cold Spring will be able to move quickly and efficiently to the trail and not contribute to the existing congestion on Village streets that occurs during high visitation weekends. Public restrooms, planned for Dockside Park, will better serve visitors who currently linger at the Visitors Kiosk at the foot of Main Street or beg to use Main Street businesses restrooms. HHFT Staff available to manage trash and recycling collection and landscaping tasks in Dockside Park will also relieve Village staff of the burden of maintaining the park. Organized parking areas, an improved Breakneck train station, and a Visitor Center at Dutchess Manor will all draw hikers north before they even arrive on Main Street.

HHFT has offered to work with VCS leadership to help make much needed infrastructure improvements like sidewalks on high traffic streets like Fair Street.

The Fjord Trail plan continues to evolve with community feedback (our shift to a Trail First approach is one recent example of this).
