Hudson Highlands Fjord Trail

14-foot-wide is actually the upper end for recommended trail width according to best practices and standard guidelines for shared-use paths. The American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) provides design guidelines seen as the standard for multi-use trail widths. AASHTO recommends a minimum of 10 feet for multi-use trails, and depending on anticipated usage, may recommend 12-to-14-foot widths. Again, this is a standard for shared use paths, with precedents all over the country. The Fjord Trail will follow best practices for multi-modal trail use and guidelines like these for the safety of all on the trail. As concept design for the shoreline trail advances, determinations about the use of sharrows or other methods to indicate specific usage along the route will be made.
